
**Action taken report on Academic Audit (2020-21)**

Recommendations/Suggestions/report by the Academic audit team	Action taken
Teaching & non-teaching staff from HQ, New Delhi, is to be sent for fixed tenure as Northeast is facing acute crisis for administrative inconvenience.	Transparent transfer policy with proper balanced ratio of local & non-local staff has been adopted & implemented by Central Sanskrit University, New Delhi for all its campuses along with special provision for identified hard stations.
Extension & outreach programmes in collaboration with other institutions may be initiated and faculties may be encouraged to upload lecture series in UGC, SWAYAM portal.	<p>In connection to extension &amp; outreach programmes in collaboration with other institutions it is to be mentioned that MOUs have been signed with various Central, State &amp; Private Universities like IGNOU, ICFAI, Dr. B.R. Ambedkar College, Tripura &amp; distinguished academicians from these institutions were invited on various occasions to address the students of the campus on various current and meaningful topics.</p> <p>To encourage faculties to upload videos in UGC SWAYAM Platform a FDP was conducted on the topic 'MOOCs &amp; E-Learning Technologies' from 14 to 20 November, 2022. Further it is to be mentioned that NPTEL Local Chapter has also been established.</p>
Committee suggested for the provision of Astrological Lab and Language Lab for better learner-centric phenomena.	<p>Proper equipments for Astrological Lab is there for the learners.</p> <p>Room has been earmarked for Language Lab &amp; the process of equipment purchase and installation thereafter is in process.</p>
Committee noted that the knowledge of Vyakarana is essential for the all Sanskrit learners and for this Vyakarana as an elective subject may be introduced for all the class.	As per the provision of NEP-2020, the curriculum structure and CBCS have been remodelled, adopted and implemented in which learners have been given proper scope to choose Vyakarana as an Elective subject as Discipline Specific Core Course (DSCC).
Computer Education as elective subject may also be kept for PG students.	As per the provision of NEP-2020, the curriculum structure and CBCS have been remodelled, adopted and implemented in which Computer Education has been mandated as Ability Enhancement Core Course 4 (AECC4) for PG learners.
Details on Departmental workload also have been provided which inscribes 45	Class-hour for the students has already been increased to 01 (one) hour.

minutes/subject class hour for the students which may be increased to one hour from student-centric point of view.	
Central Library may be digitized keeping parity with modern IT enabled automated-library system. Further Committee suggested that subject-wise journals in the library of the campus may be purchased. Provision of e-journals may also be made available for the students which are freely available. In addition to this, committee suggested that more fund is required for purchase of books for all the Departments. Enough space and conservation of rare books in the library is also required.	<p>Digitization and automation of library is in process.</p> <p>Subject-wise journals has been purchased and more journals are to be included in future. Students have been provided easy access to free e-journals.</p> <p>Sufficient fund for purchase of books is kept by HQ, New Delhi, for its campuses. Even demand is being sent by Campus to HQ, New Delhi time to time if situation arises so.</p> <p>The newly built library block of the campus has enough space for conservation of rare books.</p>
Initiatives may be taken for more enrolment of the students in various courses offered by the campus as per the target of NEP-2020.	University registered for CUET as mandated by UGC for the Academic session – 2022-23 & accordingly promoted the same for admission through advertisements in print, electronic & social media.
Committee also noted that students from non-Sanskrit background found it challenging to understand Vyakarana, Sahitya, Jyotish, Veda etc. In this regard, extra tutorial classes may be organized at the departmental level to sort out this issue positively and IQAC may monitor the implementation of the same. Equal opportunity cell may be opened to cater the need of such section of students who are otherwise deprived.	<p>To address the same, preliminary &amp; introductory classes on Spoken Sanskrit from perspective of basics of Vayakarana were conducted for the newly admitted students.</p> <p>Teachers as Coordinators for each class &amp; even students as monitors for each class have been assigned the task of identifying the learning problems of the learners and accordingly extra classes even on Saturdays (which is academically holiday) were taken for the target classes.</p>
Committee suggested that sufficient new teaching & non-teaching staff may be recruited immediately.	New teaching & non-teaching staff have been recruited to maintain proper teacher-student ratio.
Committee also suggested that IQAC must have to take quality initiatives in consultation with all the departments such as conducting remedial classes, academic monitoring, data collection on students' performance etc.	IQAC has taken decisions accordingly.
Gymnasium with modern equipments and sufficient space is required.	Proper space has been earmarked. Purchasing related matter in connection to modern gymnasium equipments is in process.
Campus may initiate proper mechanism to generate internal resources of fund.	The same is in process.
NSS unit as per the parameter of NAAC may be constituted.	NSS unit has been constituted as per the mentioned parameter.
Committee suggested speedy accomplishment of the construction work of Main Building (Academic, Administrative & Library Block)	The same construction work has been accomplished. Academic, Administrative & Library block have started functioning in the same building.

Departments of Bouddha Darshan, Dharma Shastra & Vyakarana may be developed as Centre for Excellence.	The same is in process.
The Committee also observe that Ekalavya Campus may come forward for its value loaded programmes as an outreach activities among the indigenou communities of Tripura.	Total 81 nos. of Spoken Sanskrit Campaigns were conducted for the same.
